3 lovely en-suite B&B rooms with views of the garden and woods beyond. The large guest lounge has a log burner and TV with a supply of games and books to keep you warm and entertained in the evenings. A dog-friendly B&B, but they do make a small charge if you bring more than one dog.

Outdoors they offer a mix of basic camping on 5 large pitches in the hay meadow and nearly wild style camping in the water meadow and woods. It's family friendly and children love the freedom of playing in the woods and the river which runs through the grounds.

There is direct access to the Wray Valley Trail which connects us to Moretonhampstead and Lustleigh and on to Bovey Tracey and out on to Dartmoor. The Trail is part of the Dartmoor Way cycling route and we are only 2 miles from the main route from Lands End to John O'Groats.

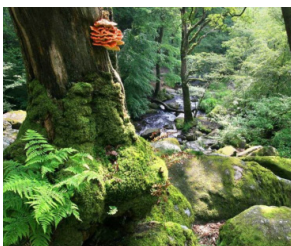


Green Hill Arts

Based in Moretonhampstead and one of Devon's most prominent Art Galleries, Green Hill is attracting the attention of some of the most respected South West Artists. Names such as Peter Randall-Page, Susan Derges, and Peter Stiles have become synonymous with Green Hill, having exhibited in the Gallery's large attractive contemporary space, and supported the Gallery's developing programme.

The Art Shop offers space for artists to exhibit and sell their work from paintings, prints and ceramics through to textiles, wood and ironwork. Within this imaginatively converted former Primary School there are studio and creative workspaces for hire, mixed use offices, a Youth Centre and Heritage Archive.



Becky Falls Woodland Park

Set within a spectacular ancient valley, Dartmoor's famous Becky Falls has been attracting visitors since 1903, and no trip to Devon would be complete without a visit.

Enjoy breath-taking woodland walks, taking time to explore over 50 acres of woodland and streams which are rich in wildlife. There is a choice of trails to suit all ages and abilities. Choose the Blue Trail for a more gentle walk along the Becka Brook and through the ancient oak woodland, the Red Trail is where you will discover the stunning waterfall and its dramatic 70ft drop at the heart of the park. Why not have a go at the notoriously fun boulder scramble and if you enjoy that, carry on to the Purple Trail for views of the beautiful lower falls on more rugged terrain.
